



In 5th grade, she danced "Dungaree Doll" in a school talent show. Dawn married & was a mom at 21, two sons & a daughter. Dawn showed strong leadership qualities from an early age, starting as a secretary, owning a cosmetic company, manager of a Tupperware business with many employees; and she owned an Interior Design Company. She moved to Arizona 18 years ago and was a licensed real estate agent to boot. Our roving reporter, Marilyn O'Connell, met Dawn; and by bringing her into the Ms. Senior Arizona Pageant, Dawn reunited with Rita Phillips and forming a strong bond with Nancy Thompson & Rosie Wehbe, all contestants in last year's pageant. Marguerite & Pat Murtagh were constant comeback friends & come back, she did. Welcome our well, new President of the Cameo Board!

Ms. Senior New York 2000, Marguerite Murtagh: Our lovely & gracious queen from New York! One of eight children (kudos to Mom & Dad), born in Providence, Rhode Island; moved at age 3 to Salem, Massachusetts. Ballet dreams filled her head but no money for dances lessons; so, she babysat at age 13 & 14 and held out 25¢ for lessons & gave the rest (\$1.00) to her mother. Shirley Temple (like Marilyn O'Connell) inspired Marguerite & in one recital was wearing a "happy in scrappy" costume made from scraps of another girl's outfit. Marguerite met Pat in college (Boston), they "distance-dated" by mail & they married and have 3 children, 2 boys & a girl. Marguerite continued lessons, ballet & tap; dancing chorus in many New York shows; retired and joined a senior dance group. Living in Long Island, Marguerite drove 150 miles to rehearsals of the Ms. Senior New York Pageant and won; meeting Marilyn Joyce & Robin Colagrande in Las Vegas (at Nationals). She & Pat moved to Mesa & she joined our Cameo Club. She has graced many of our shows & is a friend to all. In April, 2011, the trials began for her & Patrick. First, her cancer fight & then shingles. Radiation treatments for the cancer & so much darn pain from the shingles. Pat had open heart surgery.
