Helena Chapin: Our very active member from Wickenburg, especially "Shop for a Cause" event and behind the scenes in our pageant. She was in the 2005 pageant with me (Marilyn) and I asked her if I could share our very special moment in the dressing room that evening – yes. I noticed a silver heart amulet pinned on her bra; she said it held the ashes of her son who died at age 33. We held hands & cried....a quiet moment, new friends caring & sharing together. Isn't this what the pageant is all about? Helena, born in California, is nearly a native coming to Arizona at 1½ years old. Raised in Mesa, her history includes a 2-year stay with her 2 brothers in a children's home while her divorced mother got back on her feet. She met Charlie (Chuck) at Luke Air Force Base in 1971. Her date was late & Chuck approached & kept her company until her date came – "So long, late date!" Chuck & Helena were married the same year; family consisted of 4 children & 2 stepchildren. She met Teddie Sue who remarked......"You are too young for Ms. Senior Arizona Pageant." Helena qualified, however. She competed in Mrs. Arizona Pageants in 2003, 2004 & 2008. Thank goodness, she likes pageants; they brought her to us. Her simple philosophy – be happy. Amen!

Martha Gessel: We have missed you girl! Included is a brief time line regarding the horrific accident. Martha fell on a dark street on April 22, 2010, in San Antonio, Texas. Surgery on her leg was delayed 2 miserable days; 4 days in the hospital & 3 weeks in a skilled nursing center. Martha went to Texas to visit her mother in hospice & did see her often before the accident. Martha returned home & the worst happened...her mother died. Martha, at risk for blood clots, could not travel back to Texas for the service; but thanks to a DVD of the service, she felt somewhat present. Martha had wrist surgery this past May; she was injured getting in & out of a wheelchair. And then, on August 3rd, another surgery to remove hardware finds her in recovery AGAIN! Martha, born in Texas, married Steve & has 4 children & 8 grandchildren. She wanted to dance from an early age of 6 or 7. She went to talent shows every Saturday, sometimes winning. Martha has a Bachelor's Degree in health, physical recreation & dance; a Master's Degree in health & wellness. She is a certified judge in the Miss America Pageant system, having judged and/or produced over 50 pageants. This beauty then won the title of the Mrs. Arizona – America Pageant in 1985. And lo & behold...was active in our pageants 1991 – 1994, before Marilyn & Robin came on board. Martha basks in the circle of love that surrounds her still from family & Cameo sisterhood during her recovery process. Shall we dance, Martha? Hurry back to us!

Ms. Senior New York 1999, Jean McCurdy: Lucky we are when Jean moved to Arizona & joined our Cameo Club & became a part of our lives. She was born in Atlantic City, NJ., and dancing was a very early passion. Her greatest joy at age 7 – 9 was dancing in front of a long mirror in her parents' room & making up her own music. She & her girl dance partner won 3rd place on Paul Whiteman's TV Teens Show as "Two Steps" & won a watch. Jean took tap & ballet lessons & taught tap dancing at age 12; ballet wasn't a favorite. She & Bill met in grade school; Jean in 6th grade & Bill in 8th. More about Bill later. At 18, Jean moved to New York where she & her sister Joan lived with an aunt in Brooklyn. An avid reader, Jean spent a lot of time in the New York Public Library & walked all over New York. Jean was a dance major at Julliard; having qualified & auditioned. No wonder she's so accomplished! She also worked at a bank & earned a two-year degree at Empire State College. Bill, now out of the U.S. Air Force, married our darling girl in 1959; 4 children, 2 grandchildren & 1 great grandson Sean, who is 1-year old now. Jean competed in the Ms. Senior New York Pageant 1999 & won the title; then, moved to Phoenix shortly after. She was our Artistic Performance Director (with Herme) for more than 2 years, hauling that big sound system machine around....so heroic! Great job, Jean! Thank you for showing us off! 
